## BUILDING REPAIR

You may remember that in May of 2006, we did some mold remediation in the mechanical rooms adjacent to the Social Hall. Originally, it was thought that the problem was due to condensation, but later we discovered that rain water was penetrating the building under certain weather situations. Over the last year, the Diocesan Superintendent of Buildings and various contractors have been trying to determine the exact cause of, and the best solution to, the situation. The planning stage is now complete and, as you can see, the repair work has begun. This problem has been determined to have existed since the original construction, thus the cost of the repair will be covered by the insurance company. No funds donated by parishioners of Pope John XXIII will be used in this project.

## FINAL PLEDGE SUNDAY REPORT

The final results are as follows:  
Bishop's Annual Appeal = 204 pledges for \$45,437.00 – 152% of goal  
Parish Offertory = 279 pledges for \$364,524.00 – 91% of goal  
Building Fund (Debt Reduction) = 187 pledges for \$148,018.00 – 81% of goal

We want to thank all of our parishioners who participated in our first annual "Pledge Sunday." Your generosity is deeply appreciated. The Bishop's Annual Appeal was 152% of target, thus we will get a nice return to the parish. Although the Parish Offertory pledges were 91% of what we need, there are nevertheless a number of parishioners who did not fill out a pledge card, but do support the offertory collection. Taken together, these contributions will amply cover our operating needs for the coming fiscal year. Likewise, we expect to be able to cover our debt reduction payments for this year. It is, however, interesting that the number of pledges for the Building Fund (187) were significantly fewer than for the Offertory (279). We thank all who have been contributing to the Building Fund over the years, either through the special envelope each month or through the Many Gifts – One Spirit capital campaign. We hope that these gifts will continue. The total cost of the present Phase One building was \$2.9 million, and although the current debt is down to \$1.9 million, we still have a lot of work to do on debt reduction. Again, we thank everyone for their participation.

## WORDS OF OUR PATRON, BLESSED JOHN XXIII

### An Inalienable Possession

There is a television programme which, I am told, is very interesting, and which is intended to prevent fatal accidents and to appeal for moderation of speed: "The road belongs to everyone." I wish to repeat these words with reference to the subject of morality, which demands mutual respect, with especial reverence of children. Woe to whoever violates the innocence which naturally belongs to every one of them, and so sends them out unarmed into the great battles of life! It is not a question of severity or intolerance, but of fundamental principles, without which families and nations alike fall into ruin. It is enough to have common sense (and every man worth his salt has this), it is enough to respect the noble values of a civilization which is based on the religious aspect of life and its duties, it is enough to appeal to the principles of natural morality, in order to find ourselves in agreement about this. And as for the Christian: he is the temple of the Holy Spirit, a member of the Mystical Body of Jesus; he is a follower of that doctrine which preaches self-denial, and purity of heart, speech and behaviour, in order to make men healthier, freer and more noble. Innocence is of its own nature inalienable, and where our children are concerned, we are its keepers and guardians.
