## PUBLIC RECITATION OF THE ROSARY DURING THE "YEAR FOR PRIESTS"

Pope Benedict XVI has declared the time period of June 19, 2009 through June 19, 2010 the "Year of the Priest." The Holy Father Benedict XVI announced this decree on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the death of St. John Vianney, a shining model of a Pastor dedicated to the service of the people of God. ## CANAL WINCHESTER FOOD PANTRY

The new Director of the Canal Winchester Food Pantry, Janet Richardson, has announced that the Food Pantry is converting to a new model of service called the "Choice" model currently being used by many Food Pantries across the nation. The clients are escorted into the Food Pantry shelves, which have been arranged to coincide with a card which uses USDA guidelines to guide people on choosing the correct number of items from each food group for their size of families. This allows the clients to choose their preferences and provide basic special diet needs much more than before. When certain items are needed, we can now maintain an inventory system that will be more specific to the general population of clients. This particular model also saves space in our facility, and uses less, but more specific volunteer time working with the people directly. Relationship is also our mission to the community. Volunteers needed! Our need is for increments of time as small as two hours a week, needed primarily on Monday and Friday afternoons, from 1:00-3:00 p.m., which is the preferred time for most of our clients. We will be having food distribution two or more (as need dictates) Wednesdays a month, from 4:00-6:00 p.m., to accommodate both working clients and volunteers.

## WORDS OF OUR PATRON, BLESSED POPE JOHN XXIII RENEWAL OF THE SPIRIT

In these days, we are always hearing the cry: "We must make all things new" (cf. Rev. 21.5). Everything must be brought up to date: the advance of scientific knowledge has transformed old ways of living, thinking and acting. Now we, that is the Church, give a cordial welcome to all technical progress, and willingly avail ourselves of improvements in our food and drink, in rest and recreation, in all the requirements of our social life. But the apostle's command is twofold; he says also: Do not seek to follow the fashion of the day, which is changeable and fleeting, but transform yourselves into what is always new, into Christ Jesus. St. Augustine comments with characteristic subtlety: "We must be changed, not in order to conform to the fashion of this world, but in order to grow more like the Son of God. Therefore do not put on the clothing of this world, like the worldly, the vain, the proud and ambitious, and those who seek only what is of this earth, indifferent or hostile to what is heavenly and eternal. "But put on the Lord Jesus Christ" (Rom. 13.14). This eagerness to clothe ourselves in Christ must be felt every day. Pope St. Gregory has something brilliant to say about this: "The love of God which burns in our hearts is of such splendour and beauty that it increases in fervour with every new dawn. The spirit never grows old with the passing years, and is always in time to renew itself." Taken from the book, *Prayers and Devotions From Pope John XXIII*, His personal thoughts for every day of the year.
