WORDS OF OUR PATRON, BLESSED POPE JOHN XXIII Feast of St. Martha

A few days before his death, Jesus told his disciples that the hour was approaching when he would have to suffer greatly: "The Son of man...will be mocked and shamefully treated,... they will kill him, and on the third day he will rise" (Luke 18.32-33). And so it came to pass: he rose indeed "on the third day." In the last hours of his sojourn on this earth he foretold what would happen to his Church: the trials and opposition she would encounter, and the bloody battles. And he went on to say that he had overcome the world, and would be with them until the end of time. Since then, many centuries have gone by, with all their history, but we are sure that at the end of time will be seen the eternal glory of Christ the Son of God, and of all those who have believed in him. "Martha...I am the Resurrection and the Life...do you believe this?" (John 11.25-26). The faith of a humble woman was considered worthy to represent the faith of all mankind in Christ the Saviour. Our memories of Holy Week make us more confident about the mystery of Jesus Christ our divine Brother, the Word of God made Man, "for us men and for our salvation"; the target of all human malice, the "sign that is spoken against" throughout the centuries, despised and rejected, yet always glorious and all-conquering.
