## WORDS OF OUR PATRON, BLESSED POPE JOHN XXIII THE LABORER'S WAGE

The laborer deserves a just wage: this is what Our Lord Jesus Christ means when He said: "the laborer deserves his food" (Matt. 10.10). A man's work is sacred, because it is the work of a rational being, raised to the dignity of a son of God. The Christian social doctrine is very clear on this point, and solemn papal pronouncements have testified to the Church's motherly solicitude for the conditions of the laborer. First of all, you must have faith in God, without whose assistance it is impossible to achieve any lasting success even in this material world. "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain. Unless the Lord watches over the city, the watchman stays awake in vain" (Psalm 126). Faith in God then but also faith in yourselves, in the wonderful powers which the Lord has given to every man for the development of his personality, in his chosen way of life. In the first pages of the Sacred Book, it is written that God created man in His own image and after His own likeness, and placed him in the Earthly Paradise so that he might cultivate it and watch over it. What dignity and strength come to man from this divine purpose, because of which he shines in the reflected splendor of the heavenly Father! So you must have faith in yourselves: avoiding the dangers of selfish individualism, which isolates and paralyzes every effort, and the cowardice which holds you back, and the habit of conformism. It is necessary also to cultivate a profound sense of solidarity, and mutual assistance, sharing in common your efforts and your successes.
