## H1N1 VIRUS

In anticipation of flu season, we are taking some precautions during our celebration of the Liturgy. First of all, there will be hand sanitizer available on the table in the Gathering Space, and we encourage all of our parishioners to use it before Mass. Also, hand sanitizer will be on the credence table in the sanctuary, and all Eucharistic Ministers will use it immediately before distribution of Communion. The Holy Water fonts will be cleaned and sanitized each week and fresh water will be added and blessed. We will continue the Sign of Peace, but if you choose not to shake hands, simply fold your hands and say to the person next to you, "Peace be with you." All should understand the reason for this and not see it as rude or unfriendly. We will also continue the distribution of Communion under both species, but you always have, as in the past, the option to receive under the form of bread only if you wish. However, it is **not** permissible to dip the host into the wine.

## WORDS OF OUR PATRON BLESSED POPE JOHN XXIII ALL SOULS' DAY

The devotions of Holy Church which flower around the altar of the Blessed Sacrament and the altars of the Virgin and the saints are all beautiful and precious. But this devotion to the memory of our dead "who are gone before us with the sign of faith" is particularly worthy. It is above all a meditation on eternal truths, enabling us to perceive what it is that passes away and what is destined to survive. Today we have come to pay our respects to the memory of the dead, and a tribute of prayers to the Lord for their souls, in the hope that divine mercy may finally receive them in the glory of heaven. But the memory of those who have gone before us, to whom we are linked by bonds of fidelity and gratitude, must also accompany us in all the acts of our daily life. For this is the memorial that they deserve: this redounds to their honour; this is the spirit of Christian prayer for the dead, which is inseparable from Christian life and practice. While the melancholy but stirring Liturgy of the Dead rises in the air with the chant: "Deliver me, O Lord," we are as it were invited to raise our eyes from their graves and look elsewhere for those who were and are so dear and familiar to us; parents will seek their children, children their parents, the bridegroom his bride and the wife her husband – and all those who have benefited from the ministry of a soul consecrated to God will recall the image of him or of her who was a spiritual father or mother to them.
